Day 2: We recommend a Guided City Tour to explore Northern Ireland's buzzing capital city that stands on the banks of the River Lagan, and where history's most famous ship RMS Titanic was built.

Day 3: Drive the breathtaking **Antrim Coast Road** to the world-famous **Giant's Causeway.** Continue along the scenic north coast and then down via Derry to Donegal for 2 nights.

Day 4: Either enjoy a free day in **Donegal** town with its castle, abbey ruins, traditional shops and boat trip around the bay, or drive through glorious Glenveagh National Park to the Atlantic Coast.

Antrim's Coast & Castles



A real treat lies in store with this new tour on the spectacular Antrim Coast. Enjoy excellent cuisine and stunning scenery in the comfort of a converted castle.

Suggested Itinerary:

Day 1: Catch the ferry from Cairnryan to Belfast, and head on to the Ballygally Castle Hotel for a 4 night stay.

Day 2: Regarded as one of the finest coastal drives in Europe, the Antrim Coast Road passes spectacular scenery centred round the nine Glens of Antrim.
